Are you looking for an opportunity to drive positive change for the community of St Ives and improve the future of the town? If so, then St Ives Town Deal Board wants to hear from you.

The Board is looking for new volunteer members to join it at the exciting time of the town's regeneration programme delivery which is made possible thanks to the Government's Town Deal Fund.

In June 2021, St Ives was awarded £19.9 million from the Government's £3.6 billion Towns Fund to transform the town and boost the local economy. The Town Deal Board have had an active role in shaping the Enterprise Grant Scheme which will provide capital grants for businesses in St Ives. As the Scheme moves into the delivery phase the Board will continue to steer this project and make decisions on the large investments over £50,000.
